The Season of Advent

The great proclamation from John's gospel "The Word became flesh and dwelled among us" assures us that God has entered into human history through the incarnation of the Son. The season of Advent is a season of waiting and preparation designed to cultivate our awareness of God's action in the past, present, and future. In Advent we heighten our anticipation for the ultimate fulfillment of the prophetic promises, when the wolf will lie down with the lamb, death will be swallowed up, and every tear will be wiped away. In this way, Advent highlights for us the larger story of God's redemptive plan.

The service of Lessons and Carols originated in the 19th century in England and has found popularity in many churches around the globe. With its numerous scripture readings and musical meditations, the service differs from our weekly pattern but provides a time for worshipful expression, reflection, and participation by all to glorify God.


