



Mission grant for migrant needs in Lake County

In response to the congregation's desire to support Lake County organizations' efforts addressing migrants' current needs, your Mission Committee has voted to contribute \$5,000 to the emergency fund, Tanda, at Mano A Mano. Tanda is often the only source of assistance for undocumented people in the area who are not eligible for government alternatives. This fund allows Mano to address the influx of migrants in our country. Mano anticipates providing shelter, medication, transportation, and food from local immigrant grocers to over 700 adults and children in the coming months.
