Today's Service

Ordinary Time

The times between Christmas and Lent and between Pentecost and Advent are known as "Ordinary Time," time outside the two great seasons of the liturgical calendar. The truth is there is nothing ordinary — if by ordinary we mean less important — about this time. During this time we are invited into faithful attention to what it means to live out daily what we say we believe.

The Revised Common Lectionary scriptures assigned for today are 2 Samuel 5:1-5, 9-10 and Psalm 48; Ezekiel 2:1-5 and Psalm 123; 2 Corinthians 12:2-10; Mark 6:1-13

In honor of Independence Day, all the anthems and congregational music in this morning's service are by American composers, with two notable caveats. The communion anthem is by the composer Jean Berger. Born Arthur Schlossburg, Berger was a German Jew who fled the Nazis in 1933, settling first in Paris, then Brazil, and finally in the United States where he served in the armed forces during the Second World War. He became an American citizen in 1943. The postlude is by French composer Jean Langlais (an homage, if you will, to Monsieur Lafayette), and is based on the American shapednote hymn tune FOUNDATION, today's Hymn of Response. Since its composition in 1861, The Battle Hymn of the Republic has been sung as a patriotic song, but the origins of the text are unmistakenly biblical and apocalyptic, taking as its controlling image the return of the Lord Jesus Christ in glory. The hymn featured prominently in the speeches of Martin Luther King Jr. and was a favorite of Winston Churchill, at whose funeral it was sung in 1965.


