



A Note for Today's Music

The organ music for this morning's service is inspired by the Camino de Santiago, an ancient network of pilgrimage paths leading to the supposed resting place of St. James the Great, now the city of Santiago de Compostela. The prelude and postlude are from a collection of organ music found in the Cathedral of Santiago's archives, attributed to the late 18th century composer Joaquín Sánchez. These Iberian pieces, different in style and character compared to contemporaneous continental works, are thought to have been used regularly in liturgical celebrations at the Cathedral. The prelude is a series of notated improvisations on the Gregorian chant "Ave Maris Stella," that would have been played in between sung verses of the same chant, part of a liturgical and devotional practice popular in Spain spanning the second millennium. The Offertory is my own arrangement of themes from a popular choral work about the Camino, Path of Miracles. The larger work depicts walking the Camino, as recurring motifs are sung to poetry by Robert Dickinson. It culminates as the choir sings text that describes the act of pilgrimage: "We have walked out of the lives we had/And will return to nothing, if we live,/Changed by the journey, face and soul alike. God help us, now and forever more." —Dr. Jack Reeder
