



An Update on the All-Church Survey

Men of Corinth Bible Study, Great Room/Zoom

After weeks of discussion and review of the data, the Survey Task Force presented their recommendations to Session on Monday, June 26, for the new worship schedule in the coming fall. Session voted to accept the following recommendations: Starting Sunday, September 10, worship will be a single service at 9:30 AM which will be predominately traditional, with Sunday School running concurrently. On Wednesday evenings at 6:30 PM, following our Wednesday Night Suppers, we are introducing our new contemporary and casual service in a new timeslot, where the music will be led by our Worship Ensemble. Child care will be available for both services. Be on the lookout for a letter coming from the Task Force next week for more details including how the results of the survey formed these recommendations!
